- Item E-26: In the CFFP update, the Prop O Program budget will be reduced by \$7.
 - o The Group 1 Fire Alarm project budget will be reduced by \$60,000.
 - o The Bonita Vista HS HVAC project budget will be reduced by \$1,220.
 - \$7 of the \$1,220 is CFD funding and reduces the total Prop O Program budget.
 - o Contingency is increased by \$61,213 and is now 5.9% of remaining expenses.

Issue:

Progress report on the Capital Facilities Financing Plan and approval of new and revised projects and budgets.

Superintendent's Recommendation:

Accept the progress report on the Capital Facilities Financing Plan and approve new and revised projects and budgets.

Analysis:

Total current funding for the Capital Facilities Financing Plan (CFFP) is increased to \$652,170,385 with approximately \$197 million remaining to be spent. The CFFP has three groups of projects:

- 1) Proposition O Bond Program which includes closing the remaining Proposition BB projects. Total funding is \$313,456,717, which includes \$187,483,498 from Prop
- O, \$15,587,606 from Prop BB, and \$66,839,452 from state funding;
- 2) <u>CFD Planning Projects</u> (projects that are primarily Mello-Roos Community Facilities District [CFD] funded). Total funding is \$323,145,588, which includes \$269,283,152 from CFD Funds and \$53,842,436 from state funding; and
- 3) Other Planning Projects (projects primarily funded from other funding sources). Total funding is \$15,568,086, which includes \$9,042,508 from the Special Reserve Fund, \$2,000,000 from the Mello-Roos Fund and \$3,750,185 from the Capital Facilities Fund.

The Proposition O Program budget adjustments include:

- Approve a budget reduction of \$60,000 for Fire Alarm Group 1. The project has progressed to the point where excess budget can be transferred to contingency.
- Approve a budget reduction of \$1,220 for the Bonita Vista High School HVAC Upgrade project. The project was certified by the Division of the State Architect on 5/12/14.
 The \$1,213 Prop O portion of the project budget reduction is transferred to contingency and the \$7 CFD portion of the project budget reduction reduces the total Prop O Program budget.

The CFD Funded Project Program budget adjustments include:

- Approve a new \$350,000 budget for the Eastlake High School Infill Turf and Senior Lawn project. Previously, the district replaced five lawn areas in the center of the school with artificial turf to reduce dust (the lawns get trampled), maintenance and water usage. The site has requested replacement of eight additional areas (CFD funded) and the ASB has approved funding blue artificial turf and other improvements for the Senior Lawn. The budget is estimated at \$330,000 from CFD funds (from contingency) and \$20,000 from ASB funds but will need to be adjusted after a final design and cost estimate are prepared. The ASB funding increases the total CFD Program budget and the total Capital Facilities Financing Plan budget.
- Approve a new \$90,000 budget to add a fire hydrant to Rancho Del Rey Middle School as required by the City of Chula Vista for increased fire safety at the staff parking lot and solar project. CFD funding is from contingency.
- Approve a reduction in the Otay Ranch High School Track and field project budget by \$1,567. The project is completely closed and remaining budget is transferred to contingency.
- Decrease the CFD Program Contingency by \$418,433 to fund the cumulative budget adjustments noted above.

The Other Funded Planning Projects Program budget adjustments include:

- Approve new \$100,000 budget for the Eastlake High School Marquee and Scoreboards project. The ASB has approved funding replacement of the Marquee and
 scoreboards. This is a planning and construction department project because it requires Division of the State Architect approval and requires a public works bid. The ASB
 funding increases the total program budget.
- The Chula Vista High Covered Walkway project was increased by \$5,050 to reflect actual expenses from the currently approved deferred maintenance budget and is shown for information only. This amount increases the Other Funded Planning Projects Program budget.

Fiscal Impact:

Decrease the Proposition O Program budget by \$7. Increase the CFD Planning Projects budget by \$20,000. Increase the Other Planning Projects budget by \$105,050.
